





How to install the product

Read all the instructions before installing the product. Some installation steps would benefit from being completed together because they require removal of the dome cover.

NOTICE

- Due to local regulations or the environmental and electrical conditions in which the product is to be used, a shielded network cable (STP) may be appropriate or required. All cables connecting the product to the network and that are routed outdoors or in demanding electrical environments shall be intended for their specific use. Make sure that the network devices are installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. For information about regulatory requirements, see *Regulatory information on page 32*.
- Mount the product with the dome cover facing downward.
- Be careful not to scratch, damage or leave fingerprints on the dome cover because this
 could decrease image quality. If possible, keep the protective plastic on the dome cover
 until the installation is complete.

The product can be mounted with the cables routed through or along the wall or roof.

Recommended tools

NOTICE

Stainless steel is corrosion-resistant, but extraneous rust can appear if the material is handled incorrectly. Use stainless tools to avoid rust stains or pitting corrosion.

How to replace the dome cover (optional)

The premounted clear dome cover can be replaced if you want to use a smoked dome cover or if the dome cover is scratched or damaged. Smoked dome covers and spare clear dome covers can be purchased from your Axis reseller.

Use the Installation Guide delivered with the dome cover.

How to install an SD card

Installing an SD card is optional. A standard or high capacity SD card (not included) can be used to store recordings locally in the product.

- 1. Loosen the dome ring screws and remove the dome cover.
- 2. Insert an SD card into the SD card slot.
- 3. Attach the dome cover to the top cover and tighten the screws (torque 3.2 Nm).

How to pressurize the camera (recommended)

The camera housing can be filled with Nitrogen gas to prevent condensation.

The filling process is repeated three times, releasing the pressure between fillings, to make sure that all air and humidity is purged from the housing.

Note

The camera housing has an pressure relief valve that limits the filling pressure to 0.5 bar (7 psi). During normal use the pressure inside the camera housing may drop below that pressure. For full protection make sure that the pressure is above 0.2 bar (3 psi).

- 1. Set the regulator gauge on the gas cylinder to 0.5 bar (7 psi).
- 2. Remove the caps from the inlet valve and the pressure relief valve.
- 3. Place the chuck on the inlet valve and press down to fill the camera with nitrogen.
- 4. When the pressure inside the camera housing reaches 0.5 bar (7 psi) the pressure relief valve will open. Place your hand over the pressure relief valve to verify that the gas is flowing out.
- 5. Lift the pressure relief valve to let the overpressure out of the camera unit.
- 6. Repeat the filling process a total of 3 times, leaving the the camera pressurized the last time.
- 7. Put the caps back on the inlet valve and the pressure relief valve.



How to install AXIS T8607 Media Converter Switch

The supplied media converter switch enables the multicable to send power from the power supply (sold separately) and to send and receive data to and from external alarm devices and the network.


NOTICE

- Make sure the connections to the mains supply and conduits have been installed by a trained professional, according to the manufacturer's instructions and in compliance with local regulations.
- The power supply (sold separately) and the media converter switch shall be installed in an
 environment protected against dust and water, for example indoors or in an appropriate
 cabinet.

Important


Axis can only guarantee full functionality with the supplied media converter switch. No other devices are supported.

- 1. Make sure the mains supply is switched off.
- 2. Mount the power supply and the media converter switch on the wall or, if applicable, attach them to a DIN rail in the cabinet. If drilling is required, make sure to use drill bits, screws, and plugs that are appropriate for the material.
- 3. Loosen the screws and remove the cover from the media converter switch.




- 1 Screw (2x)

- 4. Strip off 40 mm (1.57 in) of the multicable jacket.

- 5. Leave the braided shield intact and fold back the braided shield.
- 6. Cut off about 7-8 mm (0.27-0.32 in) of the Ethernet wire foil shields.
- 7. Strip off about 4–5 mm (0.16–0.20 in) of the power wire jackets.

- 8. Connect the network and I/O wires to the internal network and I/O connectors. Open the lid, insert the wires and close.
- 9. Connect the ground and power wires to the power connector (DC output).





- 10. Make sure the clamp is in place, insert the braided shield coil into the ground clip and tighten the screws.

NOTICE

- The shields and the clamp surfaces shall be in full contact with each other so that the multicable is grounded.
- Make sure that the multicable jacket is firmly secured by the clamp.
- Make sure all surfaces and contacts are clean and free from scrap shield material.
- 11. Connect the network cables to the external network connectors (RJ45, SFP) as required.

Note

An SFP module (not included) has to be used when connecting an optical fiber cable.




- 12. If applicable, connect an I/O device to the external I/O connector.
- 13. Connect the power cable (DC input) to the power connector (DC input) via the terminal block plug.
- 14. Attach the ground wire to the ground screw.
- 15. If connecting several media converter switches in a daisy chain, set the dip switch of each outgoing network connector port that connects to another media converter switch to position C.

Leave the dip switch in its default position (position B) when connecting the port directly to the network. For more information, see *Media converter switch connectors on page 22*.



If the system is not defined, use the default dip switch setting (position B).



How to install the camera

NOTICE

To comply with the IP66-rated design of the camera and maintain the IP66 protection, the supplied multicable shall be used.

- Install the selected bracket according to the instructions supplied with the bracket. If drilling is required, make sure to use drill bits, screws, and plugs that are appropriate for the material.
- 2. Route the multicable through the holes in the mounting bracket.
- 3. Secure the camera using the supplied safety wire.




Mounting example (wall bracket sold separately)

- 4. Remove the protection cap covering the multiconnector on the camera.
- 5. Connect the multicable to the connector on the camera. Use the alignment indicators to find the correct position.

NOTICE

Be careful not do damage the multicable when connecting it.

6. Fasten the network camera to the mounting bracket with the screws.

How to reset to factory default settings

Important

Reset to factory default should be used with caution. A reset to factory default resets all settings, including the IP address, to the factory default values.

To reset the product to the factory default settings:

- 1. Disconnect power from the product.
- 2. Press and hold the control button and reconnect power.
- Keep the control button pressed for 15–30 seconds until the status LED indicator flashes amber.
- 4. Release the control button. The process is complete when the status LED indicator turns green. The product has been reset to the factory default settings. If no DHCP server is available on the network, the default IP address is 192.168.0.90
- 5. Using the installation and management software tools, assign an IP address, set the password, and access the video stream.

It is also possible to reset parameters to factory default via the web interface. Go to Setup > System Options > Maintenance and click Default.



The media converter switch does not support hotswapping. Disconnect power from the switch before swapping cameras. An attempt to hotswap could cause the switch to freeze, in which case it must be restarted.

I/O terminal connector

6-pin configurable I/O terminal block, which is connected to the camera through the multicable. Use with external devices in combination with, for example, tampering alarms, motion detection, event triggering, time lapse recording and alarm notifications. In addition to the 0 V DC reference point and power (DC output), the I/O connector provides the interface to:

- Digital output For connecting external devices such as relays and LEDs. Connected devices can be activated by the VAPIX® Application Programming Interface, output buttons on the Live View page or by an Action Rule. The output will show as active (shown under System Options > Port & Devices > Port Status) if the alarm device is activated.
- Digital input An alarm input for connecting devices that can toggle between an open and closed circuit, for example: PIRs, door/window contacts, glass break detectors, etc. When a signal is received the state changes and the input becomes active (shown under System Options > Port & Devices > Port Status).


Network connector dip switches

Important

Always use the default dip switch setting (position B) if the relationship between devices in the system is not defined.

The camera attaches a particular VLAN tag to all its forwarded multicast packages. The media converter switch manages how these multicast packages are forwarded between cameras, media converter switches and other network devices. This is especially useful when connecting the camera and media converter switch to the network in a daisy chain.

By changing the position of the dip switches, each network connector port in the media converter switch can be configured to manage multicasts in three different ways.



Dip switch position		Description
Default (middle)	В	Remove VLAN tags from forwarded multicast packages. Use this setting when connecting to the network, directly or through a router or network switch.
Left	Α	Block multicast packages that have a VLAN tag. Use this setting when connecting to a device that is not intended for multicast viewing.
Right	С	Forward multicast packages with a VLAN tag. Use this setting when connecting to another media converter switch.

VLAN tags are used to create independent logical networks, virtual local area networks (VLANs), within a physical network. Multiple media converter switches that are connected to each other in a daisy chain are members of the same VLAN. The media converter switches tag the multicast packages moving between them so that the next media converter switch in line knows the destination of the packages. In other words, the VLAN tag serves as a VLAN identifier. VLAN tagging should only be used when using multiple cameras and media converter switches because forwarding multicast packages with a VLAN tag only serves a purpose when the port is connected to another media converter switch, which might be connected to potential viewers.

Note

When connecting an outgoing media converter switch network connector to another type of network device, set the dip switch to position A to protect the device from multicast traffic.


